THE CAROLINAS EXPOSITION BUILDING.

Charlotte, N. C., May 23.—The Ex-
position building for the Carolinas Ex-
position, Inc., will be erected by the
Jones Construction Company of this
city. Contract was signed this morn-
ing and calls for an expenditure of
\$60,000. The building will be of me-
dium fireproof construction and will
be 200 x 200 and contain 40,000 square
feet of floor space.

The contractor agrees to turn the
completed building over to the Ex-
position Company not later than Aug-
ust 20.
Additional floor space will be pro-
vided in a frame structure 150x250 to
be erected immediately adjoining and
connecting with the permanent build-
ing, and the building committee was
instructed by the board of directors
at the meeting this morning to have
plans prepared for this building im-
mediately so that contract may be let
as early as possible.

The building site is splendidly sit-
uated immediately west of the city.
A spur track of the Piedmont and Nor-
thern Railway will run into the build-
ing and two trolley lines run nearby
and roads approach from all sides.
All these roads will be put in good
condition before the exposition is
held. Parking space for automobiles
will be provided in a fenced enclosure
surrounding the building.

The board of directors is composed
of John L. Dabbs, president; C. L.
Etheredge, H. O. Miller, A. B. Alexan-
der, Jr., Norman A. Cooke, J. B. Efrd,
Joe G. Fitzsimmons, David Owens, J.
C. Patton and C. W. Parker.
The building committee is compos-
ed of C. L. Etheredge, chairman, R.
K. Blair and R. E. Scoggins.

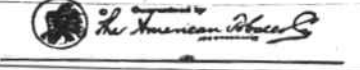
