Wednesday, Aug. 31. Had car trouble and did not get in office until afternoon. Made trip to appraise farm for the Farm Loan Association that afternoon.

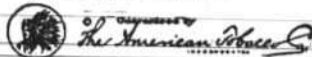

VETERINARY CORPS.

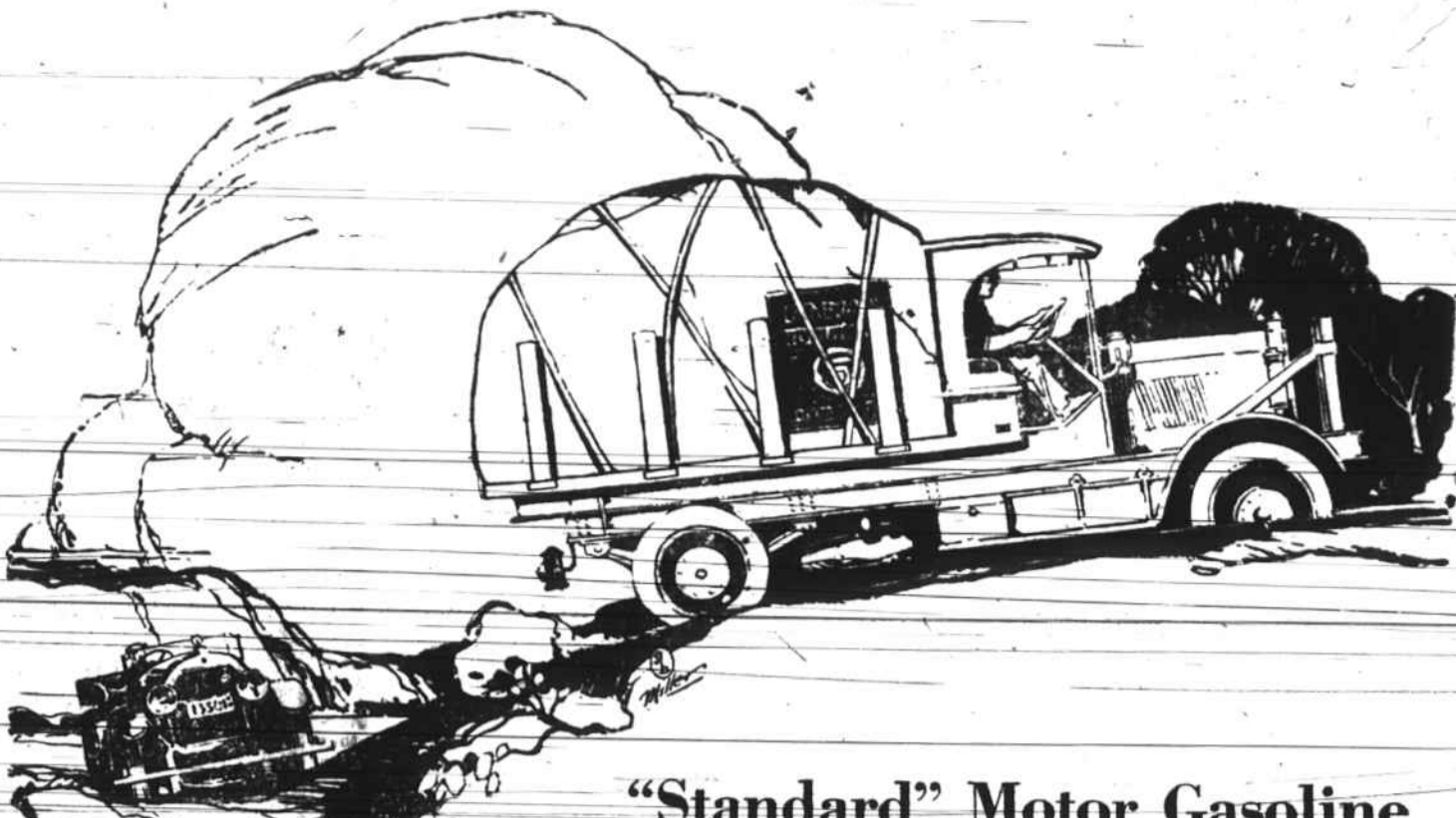
A competitive examination will be held November 14-19, 1921, at Fort McPherson, Georgia, for appointment in the Veterinary Corps, Regular Army to fill not to exceed sixteen vacancies. Applicants must file an application for commission in the Regular Army on Form 88, A. G. O. This form may be obtained from any military post or station, or from The Adjutant General of the Army, Washington, D. C.

Applicants must be members of the Veterinary Officers' Reserve Corps at the time of taking the examination. Application should be made to The Adjutant General of the Army for commission in the V. O. R. C. by those applicants who are not now members, stating the purpose of the applicant.

No candidates will be examined who will not be at the probable times of appointment between the ages of 21 and 30 years. This is estimated as about January 1, 1922.

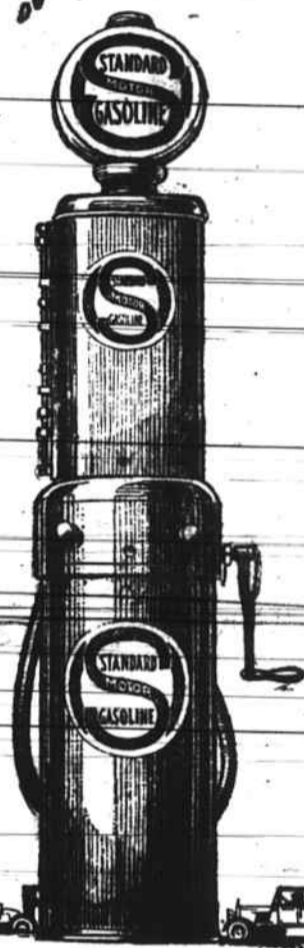
