Hand-Made Toys



Here are two of many animals that are due to arrive on Christmas morning. A black kitty that will stand any amount of hard usage is very easy to make, requiring only a pair of silk stocking tops that have survived the worn-out feet. Cut off the worn feet and trim out the ankles in a curved line to form the ears. Sew a seam along this line, turn right side out and stuff with cotton to form the body. Wind the remainder of the tops with small cord to form the tail and tie a gay bow of ribbon at the end. Two white bone buttons make the eyes and heavy silk floss the mouth and whiskers and Miss Kitty is dressed up with a bow at the neck. The elephant is made of gray duvetye, plush or canton flannel and cut by a paper pattern. His eyes are shoe buttons, his tusks white cloth.

Seventy acres of the following described land: One tract of land in Cypress Creek township, Franklin county, North Carolina, described as follows: Beginning at a corner stake in the Pennie Wilder Heir's line and runs a west course to Cypress Creek, thence down the meanders thereof to the said Pennie Wilder or old W. B. Williams line, and runs with same old line north with its variations to the beginning, containing one hundred acres, more or less, reserving one-fourth of an acre for a graveyard. This land was deeded to W. W. Lester by E. W. Upchurch and wife on December 16th, 1902, and said W. W.
