### SOUTH LEADS IN RED CROSS.

According to statistical information given out by the National Headquarters of the American Red Cross, the Southern Division not only led the entire nation in number of chapters that are organized for service in time of emergency, but leads the entire nation in the number of chapters that are actively carrying on a peace time program.

Officials of the organization declare that this is nothing short of remarkable due to the fact that population centres in the South are comparatively few and that in the past year, the South more than any other section suffered from financial depression after the collapse in the price of cotton and recent ravages of the boll weevil. However, the figures show that for the month of September, the last month reported, in the Southern Division, comprising the states of Alabama, Florida, Georgia, Louisiana, Mississippi, North Carolina, South Carolina, Tennessee and Virginia, there are 851 chapters and of these 817 are active.

The other division report as follows: New England 125, Atlantic 343, Lake 486, Central 751, Southwestern 728, Northwestern 111, Pacific 198, Insular and Foreign Possessions 53.

A splendid variety of work is being undertaken by the Southern Division with chapters reporting on war work, home service extension, disaster relief home hygiene, nutrition instruction, health centres, first aid, life saving junior auxiliaries, and recreation.
