I arise in the morning and put on underclothes made in Winston-Salem, socks made in Burlington, shoes made in Lynchburg, overalls made in Greensboro out of denim spun out of North Carolina cotton, and dry my face in a towel made at Kannapolis.
Going to breakfast, I sit down to a table made in High Point, covered with a damask made in South Carolina, and a silver cloth made in Greensboro.
I have for breakfast grapefruit grown in Florida, sweetened with sugar made in Louisiana, hot biscuits, breakfast bacon or fried ham, or fried spring chicken, scrambled eggs, golden cakes with honey or syrup, Jersey milk and butter, all produced in Guilford. My apple vinegar, potatoes, canned peas and fruits, jellies and jams, are all made and canned in Guilford county. My Tennessee horse is harnessed by a North Carolina negro with a Knoxville harness and hitched to a plow made in Chattanooga and later to awagon made in Winston-Salem.
After the day's work is over I retire to a High Point bed, on a mattress made in Mebane, and I sleep between sheets made in South Carolina, under a blanket made in Elkin, a spread made at Feldale, Va., and guarded by a North Carolina dog.—Dr. J. T. J. Battle, Greensboro News.

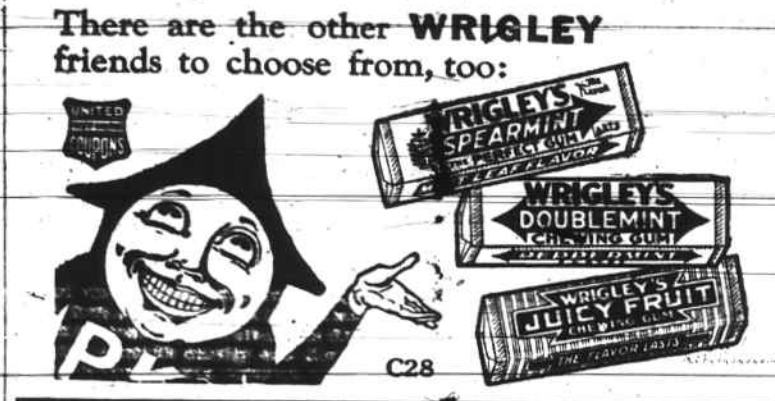
