I Solicit Your Vote For County Commissioner on a Platform of General Reduction of Expenses and Taxes.

My past record as County Commissioner shows that I have consistently followed this course. The following excerpts from the Minutes of the County Commissioners show how I have stood on some of the important reductions coming before the Board.

In Minute Book No. 6 on page 11 in the Commissioners' office, you will find the following: Dated Jan. 14, 1921.

Whereas it has been reported to us that it is contemplated that a bill be introduced in the present session of the General Assembly changing the salaries of the various officers of Franklin County, and

Whereas it is important that the finance committee of said county be allowed to make recommendations with respect to such a change as may be contemplated for the payment of its officers, it being familiar with the finances of the county.

Now therefore, be it resolved by the board of county commissioners that the representative and senator from Franklin county be, and they are hereby requested to submit to the finance committee of Franklin County such bill or bills as may be contemplated respecting the change in salaries of the officers of Franklin county before the same are introduced or passed.

Resolution introduced by C. C. Hudson. Passed by unanimous vote.

Whereas, in our opinion the offices of the judge of the juvenile court and superintendent of public welfare of Franklin county have failed to justify the expenditures imposed upon the tax payers of Franklin county in the way of salaries, expenses, etc., and whereas in our opinion it will be to the best interest and advantage of the tax payers of Franklin County that said offices be abolished.

Now therefore, be it resolved by the board of commissioners of Franklin county that the senator and representative of said county be requested to introduce at the present session of the general assembly a bill to abolish the offices of the judge of the juvenile court and superintendent of public welfare of Franklin county, and that they be further requested to endeavor to secure the passage of said bill as early as possible.

Resolution introduced by C. C. Hudson. Carried by unanimous vote.

The salary of the judge of the juvenile court being in order, upon motion of C. C. Hudson, seconded by W. C. Wilder, the salary was reduced from \$1,000 to \$300 per year, payable monthly. Commissioners voting as follows: Hudson, Aye; Wilder, Aye; Timberlake, Aye; Fuller, No.

This record shows that I have saved this County \$700 in reducing the salary of the Judge of the Juvenile Court per year, or in two years \$1,400.

I have also saved this County several thousand dollars as a member of the finance committee in making close purchases for the County.

In Minute Book No. 6, on page 260, in the Commissioners' office, you will find that I voted as Commissioner to refuse to contribute \$500 to the so-called County Fair. I refused to vote for this contribution from the pockets of the tax payers for the reason that I was of the opinion that this so-called Fair had degenerated from an Agricultural enterprise into a debauched and common carnival. I am still of this opinion, and if elected will again refuse to waste the money of the tax payers in any such manner.

I challenge any voter in Franklin County to look at the Records and find a single instance where I have not kept faith with the above platform. See for yourself. Don't listen to the idle tongues of disgruntled favor seekers whose hands I have kept out of the Money Bags of the County. 4-28-21 C. C. HUDSON.

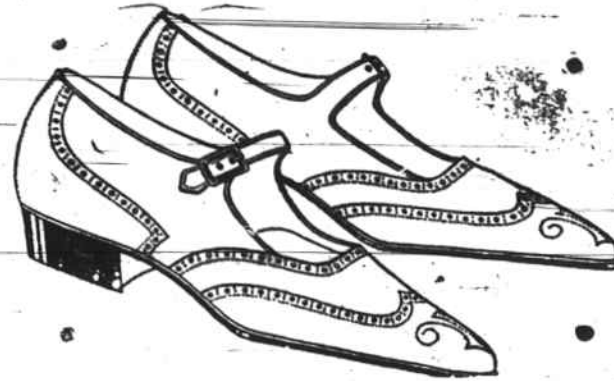
