Has Recommendations From Governors, Mayors and Other Leading White Citizens, By Whom He Is Introduced Whenever He Speaks; Is Evangelist of Better Feeling Between the Races; Negro's Place in South, Among His Best Friends, The Southern Whites.

Charles Satchel Morris, Jr., the noted Young Negro Orator whose matchless eloquence recently captivated more than 7,000 people in the city of Richmond, where he spoke from the same platform with Gov. Trinkle, of Virginia, will deliver his famous address here in the town Opera House Memorial night, May 30. Subject, "The Hour Has Come."

A short musical program, consisting principally of plantation songs will be rendered by about twenty-five voices.

Leading white citizens will also participate on the program, and a good evening in general is promised those who attend.

Especially should our people hear Dr. Morris at this time, when so many negroes are leaving the state and the South. This message is calculated to disillusion many who are blindly going North.
