Ordinances Passed by The Board Town Commissioners at a Regular Meeting Feb. 1st, 1924.

Ordinance
Be it ordained that no Automobiles be allowed to park on the streets of the business section of Louisburg, N. C. between the hours of 3 A. M. and 6 A. M. under a penalty of \$5.00 for each and every offense. The business section shall be defined to take in the following streets from G. W. Ford's residence corner to the River Bridge on Main Street and from R. W. Hudson's garage to Allen's Garage on Nash Street and around the Streets encircling the Court House.

Ordinance
Be it ordained that no Automobiles be allowed at any time to park on the East side of Main Street from L. P. Hicks corner to G. W. Ford's residence corner under a penalty of \$1.00 for each and every offense, also on West side of Market Street the entire length from Nash Street to the fire house under the penalty of \$1.00 for each and every offense, also on the East side and west side of Main Street from F. N. Spivey's corner to the River Bridge on the West and from McKinnis Store to the River Bridge on the East side.

Ordinance
Be it ordained that no person, person, firm, or corporation be allowed to damage any paved street, sidewalk or gutters or interfere with main water pipes, sewers or electric

poles lines or wires or any other property belonging to the Town of Louisburg, N. C. without permission from the proper authority under a penalty of not less than \$5.00 nor more than \$50.00 for each and every offense. All violators of this ordinance shall pay the damage cost of restoring the damaged places to their original condition.
