ARMY FLIERS PREPARE FOR LONGEST FLIGHT; NO TRACE OF MARTIN

Bremerton, Washington, May 10.—(By the Associated Press.)—On Attu Island, furthest west bit of land belonging to North America, three pilots and three machines of the United States Army Air Service rested tonight awaiting the moment when they can take the longest jump of a flight around the world in which they have been engaged since March 17.

In the meanwhile on the Alaska peninsula and in the waters of the Pacific ocean southward and the ice of the Bering Sea, northward, 1,300 miles eastward from the pausing of adventures, a plodding search continued for their comrade, Major Fredrick L. Martin, missing since he took the air 10 days ago with his mechanic, Staff Sergeant Alva L. Hrayev, at Chignik, Alaska.

It was believed here that the fliers on Attu, commanded now by Lieutenant Lowell H. Smith, would several days preparing for their flight of 878 miles to the Kurile Islands of Japan.

Well rested by hunting, fishing, hiking and sailing on Atka Island, they yesterday did the 530 miles to Attu in 10 hours and 15 minutes.

AGAINST LAW FIXING PRICES

Raleigh, May 12.—The board of directors of the North Carolina Cotton Growers Cooperative Association have placed themselves on record as being positively opposed to the passage of any law of the United States fixing the price of farm commodities.

In a resolution adopted by the board of directors and sent by their instructions to the members of the House of Representatives and the Senators of North Carolina the board says, "The board of directors of the North Carolina Cotton Growers Association; after considering the matter of legislative fixing of prices on farm commodities is convinced that such action would be economically unsound, that it would not give the desired relief, that it would encourage the dumping of farm product on the market within a short period immediately following harvest and would, therefore, result in the violation of the principles and purposes of cooperative marketing. Now, therefore, be it resolved that this board looks with disfavor on any effort on the part of the Government to determine prices on farm commodities."

THE DOLLAR THAT ISN'T A DOLLAR

In one of Professor Irving Fisher's latest computations the purchasing power of the average man's dollar is rated at 68.8 cents, compared with a pre-war value of 100 cents. According to Professor Fisher the dollar was worth 3.9 cents less in the week of April 25, 1924, than it was on January 1, 1922.

During the first quarter of 1924 the dollar was worth an average of 68.4 cents, according to Professor Fisher's calculations. The dollar's average value for 1923 he fixes at 63.4 cents.
