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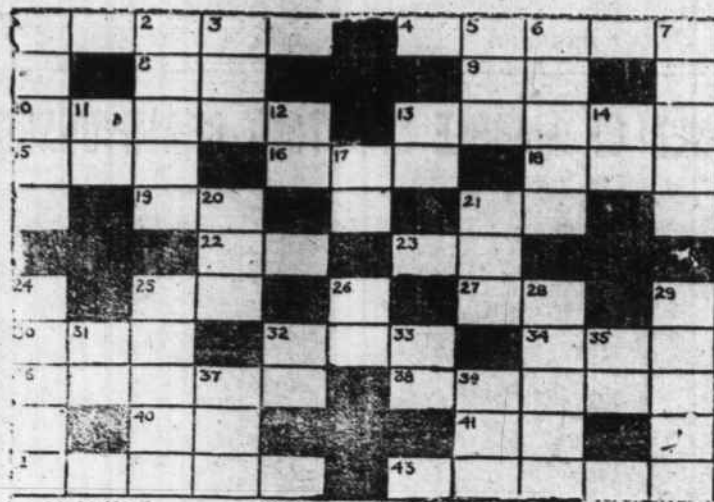

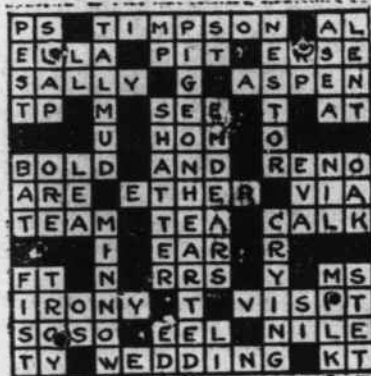

GASTON WORKING ON TUBERCULOSIS PROBLEM

Sanatorium, N. C., June 5.—A committee from the Gaston County Board of Commissioners, headed by Mr. J. L. Beall, with Miss Fay Davenport, Superintendent of Public Welfare, and Mrs. Margaret Laws Walker, Red Cross Nurse, visited Sanatorium June 3, to talk over plans and possibilities of caring for Gaston's tuberculosis citizens.

Gaston County has a large number of persons who are afflicted with tuberculosis. The County Commissioners are attempting in every way possible to care for these people. Within the next few years they expect to vote on a bond issue for the erection

of a county sanatorium for the treatment of tuberculosis. For the present they are trying to solve their problem as best they can with the aid of the State Sanatorium, county, health, public welfare, and charitable agencies.
