When sowing legumes, be sure that the land is inoculated, advise agronomy workers at State College. This may be done by using either a commercial culture or soil from a field that has previously grown legumes.

The better grade of table poultry is being shipped into the State in large quantities, find poultry workers at State College. Why not organize and meet the demand for quality products, they ask.

County Agent Zeno Moore reports that he was made referee to determine which was the better of two varieties of cotton on a field in Nash County. That was easy, states Mr. Moore, as one was Mexican Big Boll and the other didn't matter.

Pick up and burn all fallen pecan twigs, advise workers of the State College division of entomology. These twigs are breeding places for the twig girdler and should be destroyed as soon as possible to protect the trees from next year's crop of the pests.

Plow under all cotton stalks after the last picking and do this before frost if possible, advise extension workers at State College. This will greatly aid in boll weevil control next year.
