NOTICE OF SPECIAL ELECTION FOR ABOLITION EPSOM SCHOOL DISTRICT

Upon petition of one-half of the qual-
ified voters residing in Epsom School
District for that portion thereof situ-
ate in Franklin County, State of North
Carolina, said petition being in due
form and duly approved and indorsed
by the County Board of Education of
Franklin County, it is hereby ordered
that an election be held in the said
portion of said district situate in
Franklin County, in accordance with
the provisions of Article 17, Chapter
136 of Public Laws of North Carolina,
Session 1923 and Acts Amendatory
thereto, at which election shall be as-
certained the will of the people with-
in said territory whether the special
tax now levied in said territory shall
be abolished or not. The said election
shall be held on Monday, Dec. 21, 1925.
The polling place shall be at Dickie's
Store, situate in said territory. A new
registration shall be made and Dur-
wood Dickie is hereby appointed reg-
istrar, and Ople Frazier and T. H.
Weldon are hereby appointed poll hol-
ders.

The boundaries of said portion of
the Epsom School District, situate in
Franklin County, are as follows:

"Beginning at a point where Lynch's
Creek crosses the line of Hayesville
and Franklinton Townships and thence
up said creek to the Vance and Frank-
lin County line; thence in a Northeas-
terly direction along said county line
to a point where Vance, Franklin and
Warren Counties join; thence in an
Easterly direction along the Warren
and Franklin County line to the point
where Hayesville and Sandy Creek
Townships corner in the Warren and
Franklin County line; thence in a
Southerly direction along the Hayes-
ville and Sandy Creek Township line
to the Grace R. and W. G. Kearney
lands; thence starting in an Easterly
direction and following the boundary
line of the Grace R. and W. G. Kear-
ney lands, so as to include the same,
back to the Hayesville and Sandy
Creek Township line; thence in a
Southerly direction along said Hayes-
ville and Sandy Creek Township line
to the line of the Ingleside School Dis-
trict; thence in a Southwesterly direc-
tion along said Ingleside School Dis-
trict line to a point where said line
crosses Toole's Creek; thence in a
Westerly direction along said Frank-
linton and Hayesville Township line to
the point of beginning."

The registration books shall be open
from the 21st day of November, 1925, to
the 12th day of December, 1925, and
the registrar will have said books at
the said polling place each Saturday
during said period from the 21st day
of November, 1925 to the 12th day of
December, 1925.
