FACIAL ERUPTIONS

The most common facial skin-disease is acne. It does not depend upon a blood-condition for its origin. Therefore "blood-medicines" do not cure it.

This disease varies in severity, from a few small pustules to many large ones, the latter often leaving disfiguring pits or scars. A certain germ, the acne bacillus, may be found with the microscope, and may rather accompany than cause the eruption. We know that a rich, highly-seasoned diet will lend color to the picture; cheese and the like, including mince pies and fried foods are to be avoided. They overload certain glands of the skin which are already choked and inactive. A plain diet of coarse bread, fresh vegetables, plenty of fruits and drinking-water is to be commended. Young people do not need coffee or tea.

The pustules should never be squeezed. They may be carefully punctured with a clean needle dipped in a solution of carbolic acid before using, and then swabbed with cotton wet with peroxide of hydrogen. If hot wet packs are applied to the face, be sure to follow with cold packs, a minute or two after. Leave the special medication to your physician.

The acne patient should use his own towels and pillow-linen. The face should not be daubed with ointments or cheap lathers that stop up the pores. A good lotion for the face is made by adding boric acid to water, in any strength desired, for it is harmless. Lemon-juice lightly applied cleanses the tiny grooves in the skin, but should be rinsed lightly after the application. Use no face-powders containing lead or unknown coloring ingredients.

NOTICE OF SPECIAL TAX ELECTION

Upon petition duly endorsed by the governing school boards of at least a majority of the school districts within the special school taxing district, to be known as Gold Sand School Taxing District, said petition having been duly approved by the County Board of Education of Franklin County, it is ordered that an election be held in accordance with the provisions of Article 18, Part 7, Chapter One of "An Act to Amend the Consolidated Statutes and to Codify the Laws Relating to Public Schools" enacted by the General Assembly of North Carolina at its regular session in 1923, at which election shall be ascertained the will of the people within said special school taxing district whether or not there shall be levied a special annual tax of not more than fifty cents on the one hundred dollars valuation of property to supplement the public school fund, which may be apportioned to the proposed special school taxing district by the County Board of Education; and in case such special tax is voted it shall operate to repeal and abolish all school taxes heretofore voted in any local tax or special charter district located within the said special taxing district.

The said election shall be held on the 18th day of January, 1926, the polling place to be at Gold Sand School Building in said district. A new registration shall be made and A. S. Gupton is hereby appointed Registrar, and W. D. Fuller and P. C. Carroll are hereby appointed poll holders in said election.

BOUNDARIES AS FIXED BY THE COUNTY BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR SPECIAL SCHOOL TAXING DISTRICT KNOWN AS GOLD SAND

"Beginning at a point where the Alert-Henderson Road crosses the Franklin-Warren line to corner for Franklin, Warren, Nash and Halifax Counties; thence in a Southerly direction along the Franklin-Nash line to a point where Cedar Rock-Gold Mine Townships line intersects said Franklin-Nash line, corner for the Cedar Rock-Cypress Creek Special Taxing District; thence in a Westerly direction along the northern line of said Cedar Rock-Cypress Creek Special Taxing District as same now runs to a point where Sycamore Creek crosses the Halifax Road; thence westwardly along said Halifax Road to the southwestern corner of the Moulton Hayes School District in the Louisburg Graded School District line; thence in a northerly direction along the western boundary line of the Moulton Hayes School District to the old O. Z. Edwards mills; thence about north in a straight line to the point of the beginning."

The registration books shall be open from the 12th day of December, 1925, to the 9th day of January, 1926, and the Registrar will have said books at the said polling place on each Saturday during said period from the 12th day of December, 1925, to the 9th day of January, 1926.
