

GOAL OF \$5,000,000 SET UP 1. In the hope of enabling the mission boards and other agencies of the Convention to take care of their indebtedness gradually without having to too greatly curtail their present work, an objective of \$9,000,es was set up for 1927, on endation of the Co-operative orphanages and hospitals and ministerial reflief, thus taking care of both the state and Southwide Baptist work. It is heped the Southwide portion of the budget will amount to at least \$4,000,000.
