OUR RALEIGH LETTER

there is little prospect of a serious attempt to unseat the Major with a certificate of election in his pocket.

It appears that the boundary line between North and South Carolina recently located will not stay put and the Governor of the Tar Heel Commonwealth has issued a proclamation calling upon officials of the State and of the counties along the line to arrest any one found removing, defacing, or otherwise interfering with the markers of such line.

The report of the County Advisory Commission recently given the O. K. indicates that not more than twenty-one counties have attained high efficiency in government and the county government laws passed by the last legislature and that the laws enacted are widely disregarded and out of harmony with the general idea of improved methods of county finance.

During the past twelve month period 655 persons lost their lives from automobile accidents and wreckless driving is said to have been the cause of the greater number of them.

An automobile contested the right of way with the Seaboard's Florida Limited at a grade crossing in Wake Forest during the week causing the death of the driver of the car and the wreck of the train which jumped the track and demolished the end of a three story building.

State employees get a holiday from 1 o'clock last Saturday until Wednesday morning, December 26, according to a decision of the Salary and Wage Commission and all of them are taking advantage of the opportunity for a lay-off except Clerks in the Motor Vehicle Bureau of the Department of Revenue who are working constantly in the effort to supply the demand for license tags before the end of the month.

The State Judicial Conference is scheduled to meet here on the 27th and 28th of the present month to consider another effort to secure the enactment of certain laws defeated in the General Assembly of 1927.

The 17th annual meeting of the Southern Livestock Association which was postponed on account of the influenza epidemic will probably be held at State College on January 21, 22 and 23, 1929, according to Earl Hostetler, secretary.
