

HON. H. D. COOLEY TO SPEAK

At Franklin County Memorial Services To Be Held in Louisburg Sunday, June 2nd, at 2:30 P. M.—Splendid And Appropriate Program Being Arranged.

Hon. Harold D. Cooley, of Nashville, one of North Carolina's most gifted young orators will deliver the Memorial address at the Franklin County Memorial Association's Memorial exercises to be held in Louisburg on Sunday afternoon, June 2nd, 1929, at 2:30 o'clock in the auditorium of Mills High School. A most appropriate and interesting program is being arranged and preparations are being made to accommodate the largest crowd ever before in attendance upon these services. Assurances have been given by many people from a distance that they will attend.

Kinston? No, Louisburg!

Mr. A. S. Sherrod one of Franklin County's "live at home" farmers, whose veracity is unquestioned, vouches for the following: A year or more ago Mr. Sherrod planted two acres mixture for feed composed of wheat, oats, barley, vetch and white clover. He cut from these two acres 14 two horse loads of hay. It was so tall that his 1100 lb. mules were hidden from sight save their ears. The crop was so thick that in cutting, it was necessary to have a man throw the hay down behind the mower. An idea of the rapid growth and density of the crop may be had from the fact that there were found in the field three dead rabbits, five dead woodrats and two dead snakes. The same land produced for a fall crop twelve two horse loads of hay of peavines, etc.

WORK PROGRESSING AT LOUISBURG COLLEGE

Work is progressing very fast on the West Wing at Louisburg College which was demolished in the fire early in the month of December, 1928, and brick and sand are being hauled to the college preparatory to rebuilding the Main Building.
