### NELLIE BURNETTE BAILEY (1895-1929)

I wish I could write a book in memory of every mother; they every one so richly deserve to be praised and honored. And the story of any mother's sufferings, her sacrifices, and her achievements, would fill many worthy volumes. But I want to say just a word about one of our sweet little mothers in Franklin County who slipped out into the better world on February 26.

Nellie Burnette Bailey was born December 20, 1889, near Laurel, a daughter of Willie A. and Susan Edwards Burnette. She has spent all her life at or near her birthplace. At the age of thirteen she was converted and baptized by the beloved G. M. Duke into the membership of the Mt.
