First tract: Containing 187 acres, more or less and situate, lying and being about 6 miles Northeast of the town of Louisburg, on the New Louisburg-Lauriel Road, partially in Louisburg and Sandy Creek Townships, county and state aforesaid, and having such shape, metes, courses and distances as will more fully appear by reference to a plat thereof, made by M.
