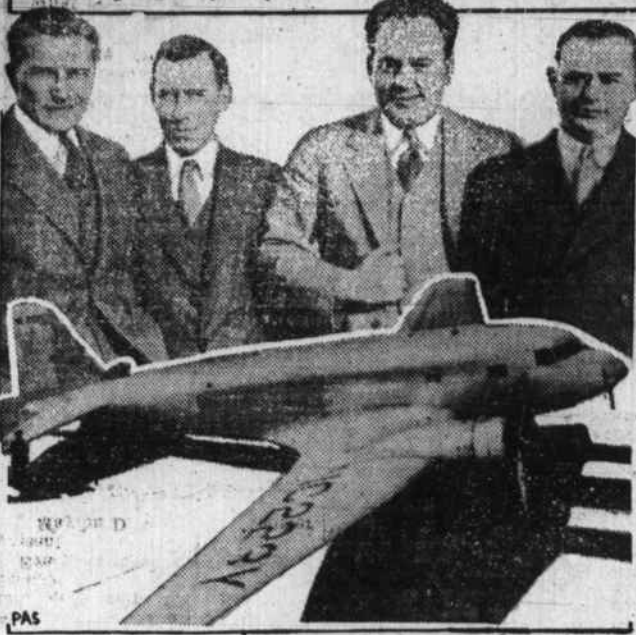


Expect "Mystery Plane" to Find Hawaii
