**AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING \$76,500 REFUNDING BONDS BE IT ORDAINED** by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Louisburg:

Section 1. That the Town of Louisburg issue its bonds, pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act, as amended, in an amount not exceeding \$76,500 for the purpose of refunding a like amount of the principal of valid subsisting bonded indebtedness of the Town of Louisburg, which indebtedness was incurred for necessary expenses of said Town, and is evidenced by the following:

- \$4,000 6% Street Improvement Bonds, dated September 15, 1917 payable September 15, 1933.
- \$3,500 6% Funding and Improvement Bonds, dated May 1, 1920, payable annually, May 1, 1920, 1933 and \$1,000 1934.
- \$1,000 6% Street Improvement Bonds, dated July 1, 1922, payable July 1, 1934.
- \$1,000 6% Funding Bonds, dated October 1, 1923, payable annually, October 1, \$500 1933 and \$500 1934.
- \$3,000 6% Public Improvement Bonds, dated October 1, 1923, payable annually, October 1, \$1,000 1932 to 1934, both inclusive.
- \$3,000 5 1/2% Public Improvement Bonds, dated January 1, 1930, payable annually, January 1, \$1,000 1933 to 1935, both inclusive.
- \$49,000 5% Water, Sewer and Light Bonds, dated December 1, 1904, payable December 1, 1934.
- \$12,000 5% bonds issued for funding electric light debt, dated January 1, 1907, payable January 1, 1937.

Section 2. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be levied and collected.

Section 3. That a statement of the debt of the Town has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 4. That this ordinance shall take effect upon its passage and shall not be submitted to the voters.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 7th day of May, 1935, and was first published on the 17th day of May, 1935. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within thirty days after its first publication.
