<b>LARD STANDS... 45c each</b>	<b>CHRISTMAS FRUIT CAKE</b> 1/2 lb. Shortening; 1/2 lb. Brown Sugar; 1/2 lb. Flour; 1/2 lb. Citron; 1/2 lb. Almonds; 1/2 lb. Walnuts (chopped); 1 lb. Raisins (seedless); 1 lb. Currants; 1/2 lb. Cherries (candied); 6 Eggs; 1 teaspoon Cinnamon; 1 teaspoon Mace; 1/2 teaspoon Nutmeg; 1/2 teaspoon Allspice; 1-4 teaspoon Cloves; 1-4 cup Fruit Juice; 2 teaspoons Baking Powder; 1 teaspoon Salt. Shave and chop the heated citron. Mash raisins and currants. Blanch and cut almonds. Halve the cherries. Mix all these together and dredge with flour. Mix the remainder of the flour with salt, spices and baking powder. Cream shortening and add sugar gradually. Add egg yolks well beaten. Add the flour mixture and fruit juice alternately. Stir in fruit and nuts. Fold in stiffly beaten egg whites. Line pans well with three layers of oiled paper. Put the cake mixture in the pans. Bake three hours in slow oven (325 F.). This makes four one pound cakes or two two pound cakes.
