Largest November

Dearborn, Mich., Dec. 16.—Production of Ford V-8 cars, commercial cars and trucks in November totalled 110,559 units, it was announced today at the home offices of the Ford Motor Company. This was the largest November production of 8-cylinder cars and trucks in the history of

the automotive industry. The total included 104,233 units produced in the United States and 6,326 units built at the Windsor, Ont., plant of the Ford Motor Company of Canada, Limited. Ford production is now in full swing at the Rouge plant here and at assembly branches in the following cities: Buffalo, Chester, Pa.; Chicago, Cincinnati, Dallas, Edgewater, N. J., Kansas City, Long Beach, Calif., Louisville,

Memphis, Norfolk, Va., Richmond, Calif., St. Louis, Somerville, Mass., and the Twin City plant in St. Paul, Minn.

Cleveland County reports an increase of cotton ginned this year over 1934 and farmers say the better harvest is due to acre yields being increased 1-3 to 1-4 from the use of lespedeza.
