Question: How can I tell when chickens have worms?

Answer: Birds that are heavily infested with these parasites are usually quite thin, there is a drawn appearance of the face parts, and sometimes a fading of the eye. The birds are also slug-gish and are invariably poor pro-ducers. When this condition ap-pears in the flock several birds should be killed and the intestinal tract checked for worms. Be-fore any medication, however you should see your county agent, as worming a flock must be done carefully to prevent the birds going into a moult.


