FRANKLAN COUNTY FARM ITEMS By W. C. Boyce, Assistant County Agent Free Terracing

Farmers in Franklin County who are cooperating with the Agricultural Conservation Program have a great opportunity to get from five to ten acres of land terraced on their farms practical-ly free of charge. Under the rulings of the Soil

Conservation Program there is a minimum allotment allowance on each farm of \$10.00 for soil-building practices, and for those farm-ers having over ten acres of soil-conserving crops, \$1.00 an acre. In order to receive this benefit the money must be earned by put ting into practice certain recom-

mended practices. One important practice through which each farmer can earn his money is that of terracing before October 31. The terracing unit, operated by the Franklin County Mutual Soil Conservation Associa tion Incorporated, terraced farm land for approximately \$2.00 an acre. Under the conservation pro-gram you can earn 40c for each one hundred feet of terraces constructed meeting the minimum qualifications of fourteen feet wide, eighteen inches high, with water furrow for the water to off, not to exceed four inch to each one hundred feet. fall The terracing unit has built ter-terraces on 2000 acres of land meeting these qualifications at a cost of fifty cents per hundred

In checking the records of compliances brought in by supervisors it is found that less than 15% of the farmers cooperating with the Agricultural Conservation Program have earned the soil-building allowance. If you desire to have terraces built by the ter-racing unit, please contact me im-mediately. The terracing machine commenced operations at Mr. T. T. 
