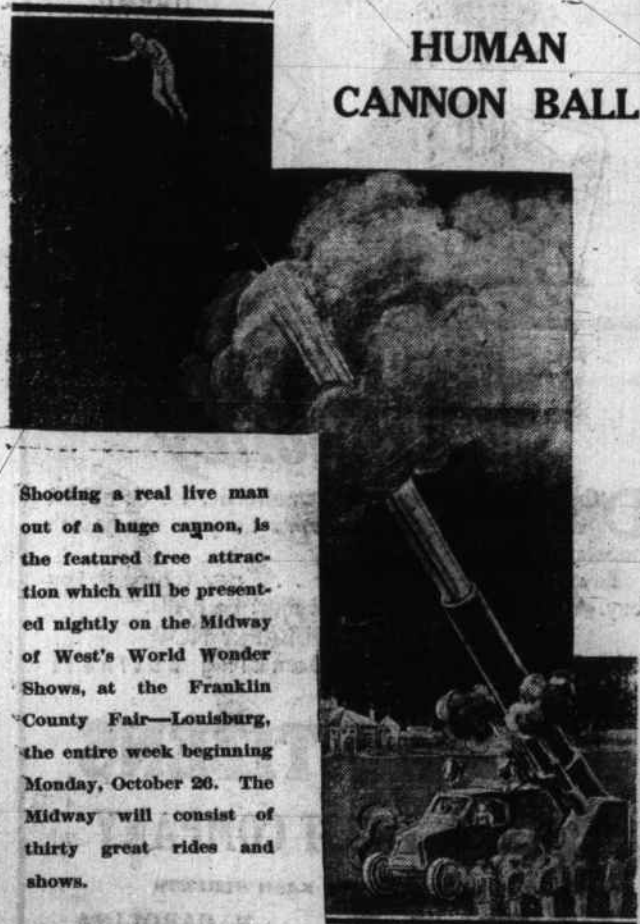

**North Italy Earthquake Continuing**

Vittorio, Italy, Oct. 19.—Light earth shocks in this section of northern Italy, where an earthquake brought death and destruction yesterday, created fresh apprehension today.  
The death toll to date, a hospital check indicated, was between 20 and 25.  
The new tremors sent residents rushing into the streets of the mountain-girt town.  
The shocks began at 9 a. m. today and continued for several minutes.  
Yesterday's earthquake damaged virtually every house in the town. Some must be razed. Several streets were closed to traffic as cracked walls and hanging beams threatened to collapse.  
Damage in this town alone was estimated at 5,000,000 lira.
