An Ordinance Authorizing The Issuance of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) Armory Building Bonds

Be it ordained by the Board of Commissioners of the Town of Louisburg:

Section 1. That the Town of Louisburg issue its bonds pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act as amended for the purpose of building, constructing and erecting an Armory Building in said Town of Louisburg, North Carolina.

Section 2. That the maximum aggregate principal amount of said bonds is Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00).

Section 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and interest of said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the Town of Louisburg has been filed with the Clerk and is open to public inspection.

Section 5. That this ordinance shall take effect when approved by the voters of the Town of Louisburg, N. C. at an election as provided by law.

The foregoing ordinance was passed on the 6th day of September, 1938, and was first published on the 9th day of September, 1938. Any action or proceeding questioning the validity of said ordinance must be commenced within 30 days after its first publication.

Notice of Special Election And New Registration of Voters for The Town of Louisburg, N. C.

A special election will be held between the hour of 7:00 A. M. and Sunset on the 28th day of October, 1938, at which time there shall be submitted to the qualified voters of the Town of Louisburg, N. C., the following question:

Shall an ordinance passed on the 6th day of September, 1938, authorizing the issuance of Eighteen Thousand Dollars (\$18,000.00) for Armory Building Bonds and a tax to retire said bonds be approved?
