JEW'S . . . outrageous

Nothing has aroused so much indignation throughout the Christian world as the outrageous treatment of the Jews by the Nazi government of Germany. Unlike previous anti-Jewish movements, the excuse that Jews are enemies of the church is not put forward now. The Hitler government's attitude toward Christians, both Catholic and Protestant, is almost as outrageous as the attitude toward Jews.

What the people of Germany is afraid of is the loss of religion. No dictatorship can survive so long as religious ideals are preached to its people. For the essential teaching of all religion is that of reverence for and allegiance to God first. A government which rules by force must command the only allegiance of its people, or sooner or later they will rise in revolt and overthrow the dictator by force.

That is why Hitler and his gang have outlawed all religions whose ministers are not willing to teach their people subservience to Nazism. They have gone back to the pagan teachings of primitive times and set up the mythology of ancient days, which was based on force and conquest, as the only religion which good German subjects should believe in.

Mussolini has not gone that far in Italy. He still gives lip-service to the Church to which practically all Italians adhere. But he, like Hitler, has begun a campaign of persecution against the Jews, over the Pope's protests.

PERSECUTION . . . money

The Romans were persecuting the Jews hundreds of years before the Emperor Constantine established Christianity as the Roman religion in the year 312. The motive behind those early persecutions was the same as that behind Hitler's now.

Jews have always been the smartest traders and best money-makers in the world. A government in need of money could outlaw the Jews and replenish its treasury by taking their money away from them.

There were Jewish traders in what is now Germany—ancient Gaul—in the time of Julius Caesar. They had almost a monopoly in international trade for more than a thousand years.

When the Roman church forbade Christians to take interest for loans the Jews became the chief money-lenders of Europe. That made them unpopular with the people, but very useful to the rulers, who had a pleasant way of permitting them to live in a country until they had accumulated enough treasure to be worth stealing, then confiscating their property and banishing the Jews.

The laws against land-owning by Jews were to force them to keep their wealth in portable form so that it would be easy for the government to confiscate. They were compelled to live in restricted sections, and that in itself kept them from becoming active in public affairs and limited their social contacts to their own people. They were thus set off as a race apart, and it was easy for a demagogic ruler to stir up popular feeling against the Jews on the excuse that they were enemies of Christianity.

CHRISTIANITY . . . hatred

The Christian church carries a heavy responsibility, as I see it, for the terrible situation in which the Jews of Continental Europe find themselves today.

We owe our religion itself to the Jews. The Christian Bible, except for the New Testament, is the ancient Jewish scripture. All of the Christian concepts of morality, the teachings embodied in the Ten Commandments, are held by Jews as well as by Christians.

The only important difference is the question whether Jesus Christ was actually the Messiah whose coming the Jews prophesied.

He was born a Jew. His disciples were Jews. The congregations who listened to His preachings were Jews. The most important part of the teaching of Jesus was that all men are brothers, under the fatherhood of God. None can call himself a good Christian who does not hold to that teaching.

preachers have led their people into hatred of Jews as a people, and many who have not actively taught religious hatred have remained silent while their ignorant followers have tortured, robbed and murdered Jews merely because they were Jews.

It is not surprising that in the countries where the Church controlled the State for a thousand years a public psychology of Jew-hating has persisted among the ignorant and superstitious masses.

REFUGE . . . freedom

Today the civilized world is trying to find a permanent refuge for the oppressed Jews of Europe. There is not room enough for them in Palestine and not enough means of self-support.

An international commission, in which the United States is represented, is considering locations in South America, South Africa and elsewhere, spots where there is sufficient undeveloped territory to provide a pioneering livelihood for a million or more Jewish refugees from Germany, Italy and other European countries.

The chances are that no Jews will be permitted to take any of their wealth out of those countries. It will be confiscated by the rulers, as rulers have been confiscating Jewish wealth for two thousand years.

Jews and Christians of the free nations, and their governments, are expected to contribute to the cost of setting up this unhappy people in a new land where they will be free from oppression.

It is quite possible that our great-grandchildren may see a new Jewish nation taking its place among the great powers of the world.

DR. BAGBY

Dr. A. Paul Bagby's ancestry through his father and mother goes back to two outstanding Baptist families of Virginia—the Bagbys and the Pollards, the late Governor of Virginia, John Garland Pollard, being a first cousin. He was born and passed his youth in that center of culture and religion, King and Queen county, and attended Richmond College, graduating with honors at a very early age. He taught successfully in Virginia and, deciding to devote his life to the ministry, pursued the full course at the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary. His talents as an inspiring preacher led to his assuming several important fields of work in Kentucky, especially at Glasgow and the Highland Park Baptist Church of Louisville, from which he came to serve for six years as pastor in Wake Forest. After a successful pastorate at Wilson, N. C., he was called back to Kentucky to serve the large and influential field at Williamsburg and to take part in courses of instruction at Williamsburg College. There his beloved wife died of a lingering illness and there he married his charming and accomplished second wife, a woman of rare abilities in social, religious and educational lines.

Dr. Bagby is a "good mixer" being at home and popular with all grades of society from the lowest to the highest. His sympathies are especially to be found in his association with young people over whom he has always had an unrestrained and wholesome influence. He was enthusiastically connected with athletic interests in his college days, was a prominent member of the baseball and other athletic teams, and of late years he has become an ardent devotee of golf, twice winning the amateur golf championship of Kentucky.

The Baptist Church of Louisburg is to be congratulated on obtaining as their pastor a man who in every respect, religious, educational and social will be a distinct asset to the church, to the denomination and to the community.

PROFITABLE LESPEDEZA

Oscar Mauney of the Peachtree section of Cherokee County seeded a rye field last March and sold the 28.75 tons of hay secured at \$14 a ton or \$402.50 and still had his rye crop extra.

NITRATE OF SODA

A two hundred pound application per acre of nitrate of soda as a side dressing to corn gave the best results in a demonstration conducted by Herbert Woolard, of Beaufort County. The corn was first fertilized with 400 pounds of a 3-8-5 mixture and then varying amounts of the nitrate were applied as a side dressing.

GREEN MANURE

To improve the land on which he will plant silage corn next spring, D. K. Wineoff of Kannapolis, Route 1, Cabarrus County, has seeded 17 acres to vetch. He says he will turn under the vetch and keep records on the results secured with the corn.

LOWER

In its annual outlook report for farm labor, equipment, and fertilizer, the U. S. Bureau of Agricultural Economics points out that "the combined level of farm wage rates and prices of commodities used in agricultural production probably will average a little lower than in 1938."
