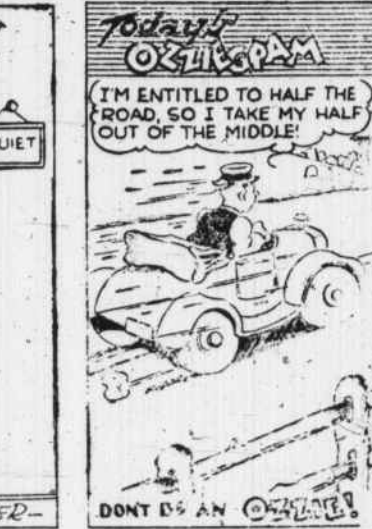

STATE OF NORTH CAROLINA THE OFFICE OF THE GOVERNOR To Honorable Phil R. Inscoc, Chairman of the County Board of Elections of Franklin County, North Carolina: Notice having been given by you as Chairman of the County Board of Elections of Franklin County, North Carolina, to me as Governor of the State of North Carolina, that Honorable C. T. Nicholson was, at an election held in your County on November 8, 1938, duly elected as member of the House of Representatives of North Carolina from Franklin

County, and that after his said election a vacancy occurred in said office by reason of the death of said C. T. Nicholson at a time when the General Assembly of North Carolina was not in session: NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the power and authority vested in me as Governor of the State of North Carolina by Article II, Section 13, of the Constitution of North Carolina and Consolidated Statutes, Section 5919, enacted in pursuance to said constitutional provision, I do hereby issue this Writ of Election to you as Chairman of the County Board of Elections of the Franklin County North

Carolina, and do hereby direct and require that an election shall be held in your County in all respects in accordance with the provisions of the laws of North Carolina, as required by Consolidated Statutes of North Carolina, Section 5975, on Saturday, January 7, 1939, for the election of one member of the House of Representatives of North Carolina, to fill the vacancy therein caused by the death of C. T. Nicholson; and you are further required to give notice of said election by publication of this Writ of Election at least one time in a newspaper having a general circulation in said County, and also by posting a copy of this Writ at the Court house door in your County. IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Great Seal of State to be hereto affixed, all in the City of Raleigh, this 30th day of December, in the Year of Our Lord one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, at the hour of twelve o'clock, Noon.
