MEETING OF BOARD OF EQUALIZATION AND REVIEW FOR 1939

Under and by virtue of authority contained in Chapter 310, Public Laws of 1939, the Board of County Commissioners of Franklin County will convene as a Board of Equalization and Review to equalize the valuation of all property in Franklin County, to the end that such property shall be listed on the tax record at the valuation required by law; and said Board shall correct the tax records for each township, so that they will conform to the provisions of law.
