ANSWER: The first item to sistant farm agent. consider is equipment and material. Always get the best possible. Galvanized pipe and fittings should always be used as rust in ordinary black iron pipe is objectionable. The pump should be located in a light, well ventilated pace where it is accessible for repairs and adjustments. Suction pipes should have a uniform slope to avoid pockets and reduce the number of fittings. These lines should also be as short as possible to reduce priming trouble. NON-POLITICAL FARM RELIEF

The farm problem is essentially a problem of increasing agriculture's cash income. Government has been wrestling with that problem for many years. It has passed scores of farm relief bills. And every one of them has been more or less a failure.

Today, among thinking farmers, the value of agricultural legislation is being heavily discounted. Such legislation is necessarily transitory. It is the product, often, of political ideals dominated by special interests. And the result is that the farmer is looking less to Washington for aid-and more to his own organizations.

The growth of the cooperative marketing organizations furnishes evidence of this. They have grown remarkably in membership—and. even more important they have grown in influence. They are gradually increasing agriculture's income by using sound business principles as their tools-some thing political farm relief has failed to do.
