HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Dr. R. F. Yarborough, County Health Officer

Dr. R. F. Yarborough, Health Officer for Franklin County makes the following report for October:

Births: white 25, colored 45, total 70. Deaths: white 11, colored 6, total 17.

Reportable diseases: Diphtheria 5, Influenza 9, Gonorrhoea 10, Measles 1, Scarlet Fever 2, Syphilis 19, Tuberculosis 1. All quarantinable diseases quarantined and placardable diseased placarded.

Syphilitic treatments 287. Urinalysis made 8, Wasserman test 57, Gonorrhoea slides 37, Diphtheria swabs taken 4. Toxoid given 160, Typhoid immunizations 2 - 6 doses, Tuberculin tested 35. Yeast distributed 20 pounds, Milk 5 pounds

A Venereal clinic was held in the Health Office each week. Three Midwife, Prenatal and Infancy clinics were held with 4 Midwives, 11 Mothers, 15 Babies, 3 Pre-Natals and 1 visitor - a total of 35 in attendance.

School visits have been made to: Youngsville, Wood, Bunn, Justice, Hickory Rock-White Level and Pilot White schools and Jones Hill colored school. Sixty-six children were in specked, two cases of scabies were found.

A Diphtheria clinic was held at the Pilot school at which time 137 children were given Toxoid.

Diphtheria continues to be prevalent in Franklin County and it is suggested that all children, especially under six years of age, be given Diphtheria Toxoid at once. Have your private physician do this or bring the children to the Health Office where they will be gladly vaccinated.

By changing from home grown seed to certified seed, B. B. Holder, Lillington, Route 1, increased his yield of sweet potatoes from 150 to 307 bushels this year.
