In- the operation of Library Service Projects, the governing objective shall be that of stimulating local reception of a more complete and permanent library service as a regular public func-tion. Library Service Units may be established and maintained only in communities where organ ized community demand occurs where reasonable and regular fi-nancial support is assured, taking into consideration local economic conditions, and where use of project facilities justifies the expenditure involved.
