Reports reaching us from many counties indicate that farmers are showing very little interest in the are showing a great interest in the issues involved and attendance at meetings held last week was unusually good for the time of year. All farmers in Franklin County are being mailed from this office a copy of Mr. J. B. Hutson's letter giving an outline of the program to be followed in case quotas are in effect. This outline is very brief and every farmer is being urged to study carefully the changes in the program as made by recent amendments. The issue involved in tobacco referendum is one of the biggest issues that has ever faced tobacco farmers in Franklin County and it is hoped that every farmer will study the issues prior to July 20 and vote his conviction that an accurate expression of the farmers in Franklin County may be indicated by results of the ballot. Any farmer who will share in proceeds of 1940 tobacco crop will be eligible to vote if registered. Those not registered will be eligible to vote a challenged ballot. However, we hope every farmer will avail himself of the opportunity offered to register prior to July 16. Most farmers will be automatically registered from their compliance reports. Regular polling places for Franklin County will be used during the referendum.

Approximately 400 low-income farm families of Craven County are expected to file applications under the Federal-State mattress-making program, reports Paul M. Cox, assistant farm agent.
