

OFFICIAL REFERENDUM RESULTS ARE ANNOUNCED

Official results of the flue-cured tobacco referendum held July 20 have been announced by E. Y. Floyd, AAA executive officer of N. C. State College.

The vote in Franklin County was 2,010 for three-year quotas, \$2 for one-year quotas, and 740 against quotas, for a percentage of 71 in favor of three-year quotas.

Among the larger counties in the State, where more than 60 votes were cast, Greene County gave the three-year plan its largest margin of approval, with 99.2 per cent of the growers favoring restricting of production in 1941, 1942 and 1943.

Only two counties in the State failed to give the three-year plan the necessary two-thirds approval. These were Sampson, where only 55.2 per cent of the growers favored three-year control, and Pamlico, where the vote was 66.5 per cent in favor of three-year quotas.

H. C. KEARNEY HEADS FRANKLINTON LEGION

COLORED SCHOOL CHILDREN

Principal Carl Harris, of the Franklin County Training School, advises about school attendance:

The Franklin County Training School will open for the fall term, 1940, on Thursday morning, September 5th at 8:30. You are all anxious for your children to succeed. School work is the most important business of the children in your care.

Careful home training, good health, religious instruction, and a thorough practical education, are the best insurance for the future success and happiness of your children.

Be sure that they have these at whatever sacrifice. The progress of your children will be greatly aided:

- 1. If you will insist upon punctuality and regularity at school, and give no excuses except for the most urgent reasons.
2. If you will read carefully all notices and reports from school, and through the principal and teachers, keep in touch with the progress of your children.

3. If you will encourage your children to strengthen their weak points as revealed by their report cards, whether of achievement or of personal traits.

4. If you will withhold judgment regarding reports of happenings at school until you have heard both sides; and then never criticize teachers in the presence of the children.

5. If you will lend your cooperation in the care of school books and other school property entrusted to your children.

6. If you will insist upon obedience at home, and respect for parents, elders, teachers, and all officers of the law.

7. If you will know the character of the companions of your children, and the nature of the entertainments which your children attend before allowing them to attend.

8. If you will arrange regular home duties or "chores" for your children so that they may acquire habits of work, ideals of service to others, and a sense of responsibility.

9. If you will seek to develop qualities of good citizenship by teaching them that one does not live in this world alone, in other words, that the opinion of others will in a large extent determine just what we are.

10 MUSTS ARE LISTED FOR RURAL PEOPLE

Ten "musts" for rural people have been compiled by Mrs. Dudley Bagley, of Moyock, immediate past president of the North Carolina Federation of Home Demonstration Clubs, Miss Ruth Current State home agent, announced recently. Miss Current commended them to farm folks of the State and said they are desirable goals for the Home Demonstration Club program. They are as follows:

- 1. We must develop desirable standards for home and community living.
2. We must appreciate the place of the home in the social order.
3. We must learn to manage our income so that it will best contribute to better living.
4. We must learn how to use our leisure time so that we may grow and may benefit our community.
5. We must always consider the promotion and maintenance of health.
6. We must be willing to lead. If the occasion arises, and be especially alert in helping others to develop leadership.
7. We must foster a family relationship which will give the members a necessary feeling of security.
8. We must cooperate with community and civic projects which will benefit general welfare.
9. We must learn to adapt new ideas to our own use.
10. And combining all the others, Mrs. Bagley listed the tenth "must" as: We must discover and use the opportunities, joy, and satisfaction which may be derived from rural family life.

ADVERTISING PURGES ITSELF

Down through the history of the United States, only a few advertising rogues have thrived, and those only for short periods.

There was a time, 100 years ago, when capable physicians were rare in this country. People dosed themselves, both with dreadful concoctions made from their gardens, and with patent medicines from the store.

Then arose a swarm of nostrums for the "cure" of every disease. These nostrums slew their thousands. Many of

them existed for no other purpose than, as has been said, "to make ailing women happily drunk at home."

But the advertising of such pain-killers and fool-killers was thrown out by most newspapers and magazines at least 25 years ago says Nation's Business. As good doctors became more common, the thirst for patent medicine abated. In their wake came some cosmetics who preyed on women's vanity, wily scoundrels who offered perpetual youth in the form of lotions and creams.

But the success of any article sold in packages depends, of course, on repeat orders. Few if any lasting fortunes have been made by lying proprietors of cosmetics. Women buy once. When they notice no results, except perhaps a rash or eruption, they do not buy again. Most of the permanently advertised beauty preparations are made of ingredients which any dermatologist will tell you are good for the skin. And reputable department stores and drug stores, in recognition of their responsibilities to their customers, will handle no beauty preparation to which women in the mass are allergic at all.

What is true of cosmetics and other packaged goods is also true of everything you see consistently advertised. An advertisement is the worst possible place in which to try to deceive. Deception doesn't work and doesn't pay.
