



Wheat, oats and barley can be grown during the winter months and harvested for grain in the Spring and produce a substitute for our summer Indian corn. These crops when properly fertilized, seeded with good seed and harvested will control erosion during the winter months and can be followed by Lespedeza in the summer months for hay and will produce approximately as much feed as our best varieties of corn.

Franklin County To Organize Small Grain Program

Arrangements have been made and plans worked out for organizing and developing one variety small grain communities in Franklin County. Plans for one variety communities will be explained at meeting in Agricultural Building in Louisburg Wednesday afternoon, September 4, at 2:00 P. M., announces W. C. Boyce, County Agent. The object of this meeting is to supply information and establish organization for small grain community work for the purpose of maintaining a reliable source of seed and to economically inaugurate a program to produce seed of good quality for distribution in Franklin and adjoining counties.

Mr. E. C. Blair, Extension Agronomist of State College, Mr. A. D. Stuart, Secretary of N. C. Crop Improvement Association, and Mr. O. F. McCrary, District Agent have offered their assistance in the program. Besides the organization phase of the program, Mr. E. C. Blair will discuss fertilization and crop rotation for profitable production of small grain and Mr. Stuart will discuss different varieties of small grain giving both their good and bad qualities and method of producing certified seed. All farmers and businessmen in Franklin County interested in small grain improvement are invited to attend and participate in the meeting.

Tobacco marketing cards and cotton marketing cards have been prepared and are ready to be delivered to more than 99% of farm operators in Franklin County. We wish to invite them to call for their marketing cards at earliest convenience to avoid a last minute rush immediately prior to opening of tobacco markets in this vicinity and prior to the ginning of cotton. The marketing cards issued are personal property of the operators and extreme care and precaution should be taken to see that they are used only to identify crops produced on the land covered by the Work Sheet for which the card is issued. The Agricultural Adjustment Act provides severe penalties for misuse of marketing cards and the operators to whom they are issued are held responsible to see that they are used properly.

The Cotton ginners of Franklin County are held responsible for reporting each bale of cotton ginned. Farmers can render them a greater assistance by properly identifying their cotton with their cotton marketing card at time of ginning. When cotton is properly identified, correct credit for yield is assured the farm.
