Call Procedure

A little earlier, Selective Service headquarters issued regulations under which the 18_{\odot} and 19_{\odot} year-olds will be called up for induction in the order of their birth dates, with the oldest called first. This is a departure from the plan followed for older men, for whom the order of cell, was-fixed by lottery drawings.


