STATE COLLEGE ANSWERS 6.72 TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS

> QUESTION: Can I cultivate my orn at the silking stage?
>
> ANSWER: It is difficult to cultivate corn after it is silking because corn roots are very low and fill up the entire space between the rows. If you are troubled with a few large weeds and cockleburs in the corn. might pay you to pull these out. as this would disturb the corn less than the plowing would. In extreme cases, where grass is about to overcome the corn, it is sometimes necessary to plow it with a turning plow. This cuts lots of roots and should have been done earlier.

QUESTION: Will the AAA furnish Austrian winter pea seed. ANSWER: Farmers can obtain crimson clover and Austrian winter peas through their AAA committee in lieu of cash pay-32.05 ments. In the case of crimson clover, growers may obtain any part of their 1943 allowance which they have not already us-ed, and in addition, may obtain an amount equal to their 1943 allowance which will be charged against their 1944 allowance. According to Patten. "Legumes are a valuable asset in meeting the food and fiber needs since supplies of chemical nitrogen for agricultural uses are limited."
He points out that, in order to maintain the fertility of the land for maximum wartime food production, it is necessary to keep 2.36 every tilled acre covered in the winter.

It is expected that in the total tonnage, from 5 to 10 per cent more chemical fertilizer will be available. available. Although nitrogen is expected to be available in somewhat lesser quantities. One change will permit the use of fertilizer by farmers who have not previously used fertilizers on B crops. The order continues the provision by which farmers are required to make application to their local dealers for crop re-quirements. They may make application for fall fertilizers and also for spring fertilizers at the same time. The fertilizer people are required to make deliveries of fertilizers for A crops before such deliveries are made for B crops.
