NEGRO EXTENSION SERVICE

The watermelon wilt demonstration on the farm of Z. F. Hill, R.2, Franklinton, in the Copeland Perry neighborhood solves the problem of watermelons dying in this section of the county.

Four resistant varieties of seed were furnished by H. R. Garriss, Extension Plant Pathologist, State College Station, Raleigh, to plant in a wilt infested plot. One hundred and fifty-two hills of the resistant varieties were planted along with the same number of hills of the regular variety usually planted. One hundred and fifty hills of the resistant varieties lived and produced, while one hundred and thirteen hills of the regular variety died with wilt.

The watermelons produced had fine quality as to taste and flavor. The larger ones ranges from 35 to 40 pounds despite the terribly dry weather conditions. They also had good shipping qualities.

Rev. S. P. Massenburg has made good with his pigs this summer. He has sold more than \$100.00 worth of pigs this summer off his three brood sows. Those three sows and one other will drop pigs again this late fall.
