ment of Education, of which he is head—and which involves authority over all the professional interests of the public schools,—should not be reduced to the status of co-ordinancy with the office handling the financial responsibilities of the school system. The pending amendment is, therefore, nothing more nor less than a design to give the State superintendent's office complete and exclusive authority to function in BOTH fields of public school administration, that of the purely professional interests and

that also of the immense financial responsibilities involved.

And this is what is behind the proposed amendment to abolish the present office of the comptroller which has been set up to manage and supervise all the financial phases of the operation of the State's school system, involving the spending of \$80,000,000 for the next biennium for public education.

And this would be by vast odds the greatest authority which the State of North Carolina invests in any of its Constitutional officers, not excepting that of the Governor!
