Washington, D. C., -- President John F. Kennedy's new defense budget totals over fifty billion dollars, having been increased by over two billion from last year. Thus the country is spending well over half its en-

tire income buying defense, Of course, included in this defense, is a lot of free enterprise profit for the munitionsindustry, to use the old term to cover all defense manufacturers. Some of the companies which build our planes and rockets and missiles make a very nice thing out of defense.

President Kennedy is finding, like President Dwight D. Eisenhower before him, that resisting all the recommendations and projects advanced, is a hard job. He has increased the military | Jget but he has also been forced to reject many things. He has rejected the Skybolt program, he has rejected the RS-70 bomber, he has refused to buy the Navy's shipbuilding program, etc., etc.,

And even doing this, and asking Secretary of Defense Robert McNamara, to hold down costs as much as possible, after obtaining the best defense possible, he is spending more ing year than in the year before

several billion more! The cost of the cold war can be realized only when one looks at the fifty percent chunk out of our national income defense requires.
