Louisburg: Street Conditions And Traffic Volume

Even though the pavement conditions improve as we get closer to the incorporated Town, the conditions within the Town need to be upgraded. Of the local road system, about 50 percent of the streets remain unpaved. This figure is much higher than that of other towns with the same and smaller population. It is evident that some improvement is necessary.

As would be expected, the largest volumes of traffic are found within the Town. Between 5,000 and 4,000 vehicles were recorded for the average day during a one-year period on various streets and at multiple intersections within Louisburg. The major problem occurring in the Town in terms of vehicles per day is that many of the roads carrying a large number of vehicles are of inadequate rights-of-way and pavement width. The result of such a situation is congestion and inefficient movement of traffic. Such a problem is very evident when we compare the number of vehicles using Bickett Boulevard and the number of vehicles carried by Main Street. Both streets carry between 4,500 and 5,000 vehicles per day. Main Street is a local street meant to carry traffic within the Town and not through it. On the other hand, Bickett Boulevard has been constructed to carry traffic around Louisburg. Both streets carry the same number of vehicles, yet they were constructed by different standards and for different purposes.

Doctor Talk

One of the real tragedies of our modern times is the widespread abuse by Americans of their health insurance. This abuse can be correlated with the general decline in morals of individuals and with our nation as a whole! It is now the accepted feeling of many to "get something for nothing." Medical insurance must be looked upon as an "investment," not as a means of getting something for nothing. The widespread and often unnecessary use of health insurance can only force the cost of insurance protection upward and thereby reduce the advantage of coverage.

Many people who frequently use their medical insurance feel that they are getting something for nothing—but this is far from the truth. They are merely getting back money they have paid in plus money paid in by other policy holders. The idea of many is that they must use their insurance to "collect"—the idea should be that you win when you are spared that accident or illness against which the insurance was bought for protection.

Many people are admitted to hospitals daily only on their insistence—the attending physician often stated that medications and rest at home for a few days being all necessary. Rather than paying a few dollars for drugs the patient insists upon hospital admission "because I have insurance that will cover everything." With the cost of hospitalization today insurance policies are designed to cover the big medical bills, not the numerous small ones that come along.

If the present system of voluntary health insurance programs and prepayment plans to cover prolonged illness is to be successful we must all share in the responsibilities of using these policies wisely, not abusing them.
