On the 900 square feet of the stage, Williamson covers 2.75 miles per performance, much of it at high speed. And of course the role is famous for covering just about every human emotion. In addition to acting training, the part of Hamlet demands rigorous mental and physical training. The program includes regulated study hours, rest, diet, breathing and voice exercises, and roadwork.
