Dr. A. Purnell Bailey, superintendent of the Richmond District of The Methodist Church, Virginia Conference, will be the leader of the annual Religious Emphasis Week on the Louisburg College campus October 12-15, 1964.

Students on the campus will preside at the services and music will be furnished by the Department of Music under the direction of Miss Sarah Foster. Chaplain C. Wade Goldston, in charge of the plans for the week, announces that the public is invited to hear Dr. Bailey nightly at 7:00 p.m., College Auditorium, and at the 10 a.m. Wednesday service.
