**The Junior Miss Makes Rice Pizza**



Though Italy is usually acknowledged as the birthplace of pizza, the easy-to-eat sauce and cheese combination received its greatest boost in popularity from the snack-loving folks in the United States.

Especially popular with the teen-age set, pizza is favored fare for lunch, supper, and late-evening eating. Quickie Pizza, notable for its easily prepared rice crust, is the kind of pizza Junior Miss hostesses like to prepare and serve to their families as well as their friends.

The rice crust is simply prepared by blending cooked rice with melted butter and a beaten egg, then baking it for 10 minutes. Any kind of rice may be used--brown, regular milled white rice, parboiled or precooked--prepared according to package directions.

Accompany the piping hot pizzas with crisp relishes, if you like, and for dessert serve a basket of fresh fruit and little cups of sweetened black coffee.

- Quickie Pizza**
- 2 cups cooked rice
  - 2 tablespoons melted butter or margarine
  - 1 egg, beaten
  - 1 cup canned or packaged spaghetti sauce with meat
  - 6 ounces Mozzarella cheese, sliced
  - 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Combine rice, butter or margarine and egg. Line bottom of a 12-inch skillet or pizza pan with rice mixture, making a rim around the edge about 1/4 inch high. Bake at 380 degrees for 10 minutes. Spoon spaghetti sauce over rice crust. Cover with Mozzarella cheese. Sprinkle with Parmesan cheese. Bake at 375 degrees for 20 minutes. Makes 6 servings.
