Cats are hardy animals. A few precautions on your part can keep your cat in the best of health. However, be on the alert for any of the following symptoms:

TEETH AND GUMS: When a cat has trouble with his teeth, he cannot eat but stares at his food and drools excessively. Consult your veterinarian immediately. Frequently, cats suffering from gum disease, have large amounts of black tartar around their teeth at the gum line. Hard calcium-like deposits are best controlled by feeding a semi-solid cat food, such as moistened or

dry Purina Cat Chow. As the cat eats, the semi-solid food massages and strengthens the gums. When your cat is four or five years old, a veterinarian should remove any tartar deposits which have accumulated.

FLEAS: Fleas annoy the cat and often carry worms and other infections. Your veterinarian can recommend a good commercial flea powder approved for cats. Never use a dog flea powder for cats.

WORMS: Symptoms include a dull coat, inflamed and watery eyes, sneezing, coughing and vomiting. The cat develops a ravenous appetite, but does not gain weight. Fortunately, treatment of worms is simple and recovery rapid once you place your cat under a veterinarian's care.

The first step in choosing a kitten or cat is to look for a solidly built animal. Feel the body gently. Look for clear eyes, clean ears, firm pink mouth, glossy coat without bare patches, and a firm, muscular body.

Other tips to remember: don't leave milk in the bowl all day. If it's not consumed within two or three hours, remove it.
