Garden Club Hears Henry Copeland

On Thursday, in the Community Room of the First-Citizens Bank Building, the Louisburg Garden Club heard Mr. Henry Copeland, representing Agrico Chemical Company, from Henderson, speak. He introduced R. E. Lytle of Ahoskie and Charles Jordan of Greensboro, both with Agrico, who participated in the program. A film was shown, "How Does Your Garden Grow?"

Many suggestions were made for lawn and garden care, and members were told of different Agrico products available for the needs of the homeowner. They suggested that one use fertilizer instead of salt to melt snow on walks and driveways. Fertilizer, in addition to melting the snow, will make grass and shrubs grow instead of killing them as salt

does. To take precautions against devastating insects, one should apply insect control along with fertilizer. The film showed how fertilizer is made, from mining to final shipment.

After the film, Mr. Copeland told of the soil testing service his concern provides locally, with their agronomist making recommendations for your soil needs. Members were given bags in which to take soil samples for analysis.
