Punch For A Bridal Shower



This is the season for weddings. To honor the bride-to-be, delicate lemon-flavored punch will make any party the one she'll remember most. It's easy on the hostess too, because the punch is simple and combines well with any kind of party food. A solid ring of ice decorates and chills the punch with a minimum of dilution. For extra color and flavor, garnish the bowl with strawberries, either whole or sliced, and fresh flowers.

The Sauterne produced in California is dry and flavorful, so it combines well with a fairly sweet sherbert to make a refreshing beverage. For a sparkling punch, substitute California Champagne for the Sauterne and serve immediately.

Sherbert-Wine Punch
(Makes about 20 (3-oz. servings))
1 quart lemon sherbert 1 (4/5 qt.) bottle California Sauterne or other white dinner wine, well chilled

Place the sherbert and lemonade concentrate in a large bowl. Slowly blend in the wine until mixture is smooth and creamy. Serve immediately. The punch separates slightly as it stands; so stir before serving. Allow about 2 servings for each guest. The ingredients can be easily increased to serve any number desired.
