"Pruning Shrubs and Trees" was his topic and he began by showing the basic tools needed for the job. Mr. Dean believes that early spring is the best time to do heavy pruning and all shrubs and trees should be kept looking as natural as possible. He said light pruning could be done anytime and to always cut back newly planted shrubs and trees to offset root loss. Balled and bagged plants usually do not need to be pruned. After a question and answer period, members braved a cold wind to join him at the Franklin County Welfare Building for an on the spot demonstration. The meeting was held at the First Citizens Bank meeting room on Bickett Blvd.

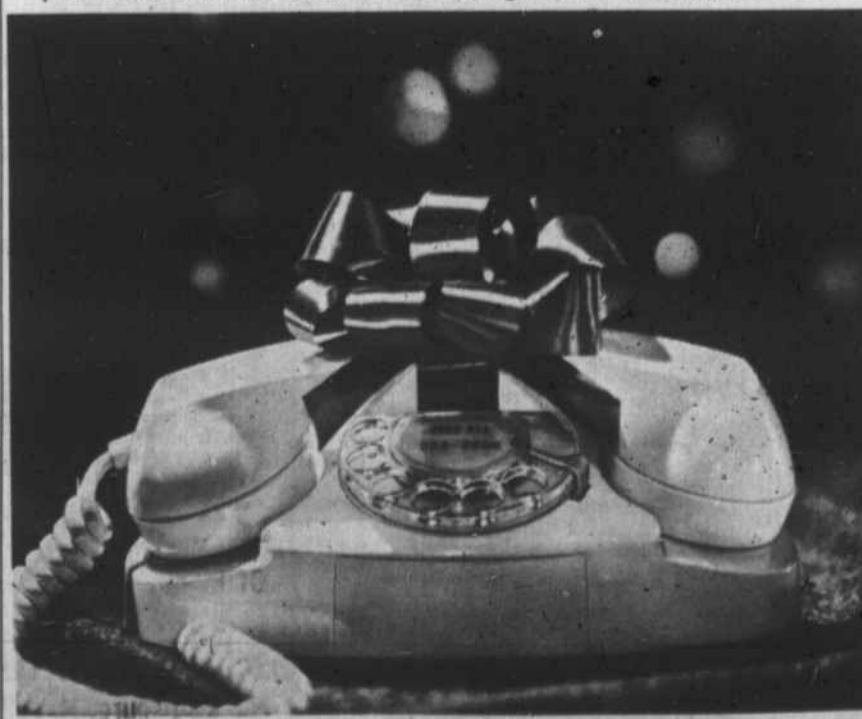
