Louisburg College Presents Stravinsky In Concert

The Louisburg College Department of Music will present Soulima Stravinsky, concert pianist, Monday, March 13, at 8:00 p. m. in the College Auditorium. His appearance here is part of a tour which he is making under the auspices of the Arts Program of the Association of American

Colleges. Mr. Stravinsky was born in Lausanne, Switzerland. He has studied piano and composition in Paris at the Ecole Normale de Musique and under such eminent teachers as Alfred Cortot, Isidore Philipp and Nadia Boulanger.

Since his debut at the age of twenty, Mr. Stravinsky's concert engagements have covered most of the European countries and South America. In the United States, where he arrived in 1948, he has appeared with the major orchestras and given numerous series of recitals throughout this country and in Canada.

Soulima Stravinsky is widely recognized as one of the foremost interpreters of Mozart and Scarlatti. His French background, and his familiarity with the great masters of that country give him equal authority in all matters pertaining to French music. It is hardly necessary to mention that he is the foremost exponent of the piano music of his father, the noted composer,

Art Education. After four years in this field, she hopes to teach art on a secondary or college level.

Trudy has sold several of her pictures and has shown others at exhibits which include Louisburg College, New Hanover High School in Wilmington, N. C., the N. C. State Fair in Raleigh, N. C., Wake Forest, N. C., and private showings in Virginia and Indiana.

The oil media, with realistic still life and landscapes are Trudy's preference, but she has done several abstracts and enjoys water color and pastels also. The painting which is on exhibit for the first week of March is a still life of Burnt Sienna background, highlighted by a foreground of ochre flowers and

a copper pitcher. The exhibit will be changed every week, with a variety of styles including still life, landscape and abstract to be shown throughout the month.
