Advise Immunization Of Swine For Cholera

One of the most important jobs to be done in eradicating hog cholera is the job of keeping all swine immunized against the disease. Last year less than 40% of the hogs produced in Franklin County were vaccinated for hog cholera. This is far below the necessary percentage required to prevent cholera outbreaks.

Here in North Carolina the use of virulent virus vaccines are prevented by law. Instead, modified live virus vaccines are recommended. These vaccines induce immunity with little, if any, danger of the disease being spread. Modified live virus vaccines produce immunity within 7 to 10 days and the immunity lasts two years.

All Quality Feeder Pig Sales require hog cholera vaccination by a veterinarian at least ten days before the sale. This

has done a good job of protecting our feeder pig buyers; however, it leaves the problem of those pigs not sold on Feeder Pig Sales and the sows and boars left on the farm.

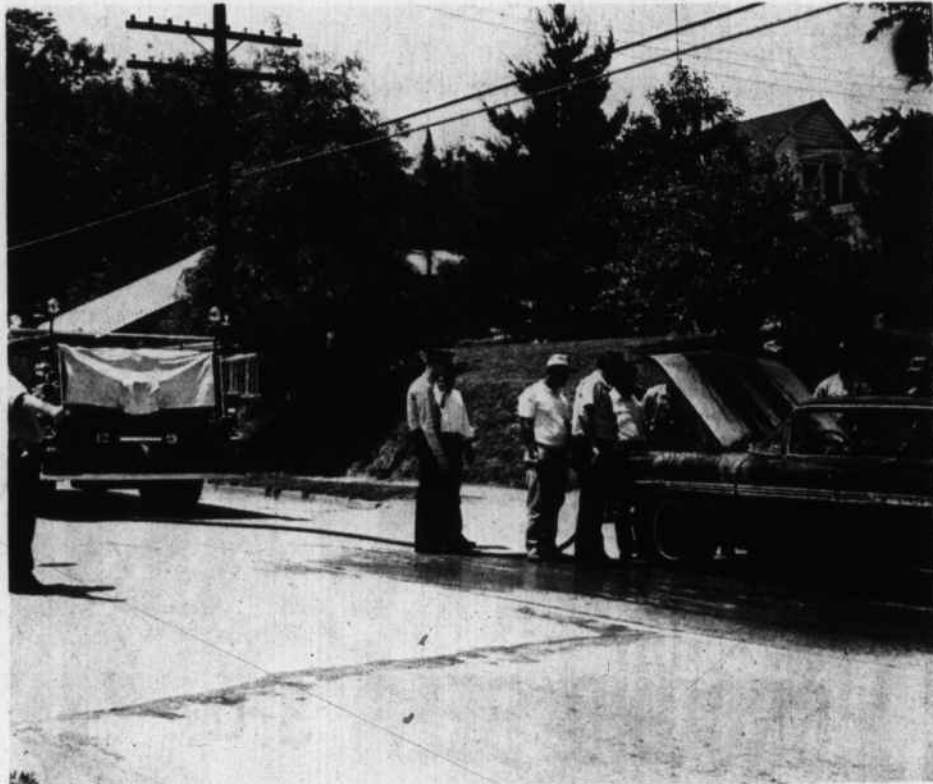
If you would rather, you can vaccinate all pigs and hog which are to be kept on the farm. However, the veteri-

narian must vaccinate those pigs sold on the Quality Feeder Sales (this would be a good time to have all hogs vaccinated or re-vaccinated).

To successfully complete phase III of the eradication program, swine producers should strive for a 100% immunization against swine cholera.

Besides the high percentage of hogs immunized, they must be kept immunized over an extended period of time.

Vaccinating against hog cholera and reporting suspected cases of cholera are the two important steps in Phase III of the Hog Cholera Eradication Program.
